Course Title

The Hip Bone's Connected to the Hyoid Bone: Body Systems and Swallowing

Course Description

This unique course teaches SLPs the why's and how's of incorporating a body systems approach to caring for patients with suspected dysphagia. Functional implementation of this approach is applied through the use of a case study that is infused throughout the course.
