Trachs and Communication: A Primer for Medical SLPs

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This comprehensive course arms the SLP with the knowledge they need to have about trachs including: reasons for trach placement, anatomy of trach tubes, speaking valves, above-cuff vocalization (talking trach), and the how-to's of evaluating and treating communication disorders in patients with trach tubes. Videos demonstrate patients using two different kinds of talking trachs.

This webinar is highly relevant for SLPs working across the continuum of care including acute care, outpatient, acute and subacute rehab, LTACH, and home health.

LEARNER OUTCOMES

As a result of this course, participants will be able to:

- Describe the differences between speaking valves & above-cuff vocalization for communication
- List all components of a tracheostomy tube
- Identify patient candidates for use of speaking valves and above-cuff vocalization
- Identify indications and contraindications for speaking valves and above-cuff vocalization
- Verbalize 3 considerations for troubleshooting challenges with speaking valves and above-cuff vocalization
